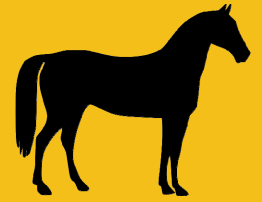




Living at Roosevelt

Weather: Summer: Daytime temperatures are often in the 70s (25c) and occasionally in the 90s (35c). Nights are usually cooler and temperatures may drop below freezing. Thunderstorms are common in the afternoons. Spring & Fall: Daytime temperatures range from 30s to 60s (0 to 20c) with overnight lows in the teens to single digits (-5c to -20c). Snow is common in spring and fall. At any time of year, be prepared for sudden changes. Always be equipped with a wide range of clothing options. Be sure to bring a warm jacket and rain gear, even in the summer.

Guest facilities: From the front porch guests can rock their stress to sleep and awaken their “Old West” spirit. This log lodge was built in 1920 in an area of the park that was a favorite of President Theodore Roosevelt. The Lodge hosts a family style dining room, beverage service, a lobby area with a stone fireplace and small gift shop. All guest accommodations are in rustic log cabins that feature old wood stoves for heat and the chance to see a black bear wander through the compound anytime, day or night. Well known as being the horse and wrangler location, Roosevelt is home to a large corral operation which offers horseback trail rides, stagecoach adventures and our popular Old West Cookout dinner.

Employee facilities: Employees live in rustic cabins, as well. These cabins have electricity and are heated by wood-burning stoves (compressed woodchip logs are provided). No running water is connected to the cabins. Shower and toilet facilities are located in the cabin area. Free laundry facilities are close by. Employees generally live three to a cabin. Each employee will have a bed, dresser and chair. These cabins have very limited storage space, so consider that when packing!

Roosevelt employees are encouraged to bring items that will be helpful in such a unique environment... a flashlight to help you maneuver through the trees, over rocks and around the stream, warm coat, something to carry toiletries in, boots to help you get around during the wet, muddy spring, mosquito repellent and easy-to-slip-on clothing for those middle-of-the-night runs to the restroom! A cabin has been set aside for use as an employee recreation area.

Sound a bit primitive? Just bring your “adventure” self to Roosevelt and you’ll be glad you did. In no time, you will be exchanging “Rosey” stories with your coworkers and creating memories. With the small number of employees working at Roosevelt, it’s like being part of a big family. We know you’ll never want to leave!
