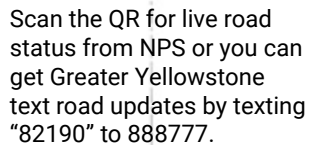

YELLOWSTONE PLEDGE

"I pledge to protect Yellowstone National Park. I will act responsibly and safely, set a good example for others, and share my love of the park and all the things that make it special."

PUT THE PLEDGE INTO ACTION!

Give wildlife room, use a zoom. View wildlife safely with a telephoto lens, scope, or binoculars. Park animals like bison, bears, and elk are dangerous and have harmed people. Keep 100 yards (91 m) from bears and wolves, and 25 yards (23 m) from other animals. Never approach, encircle, follow, or feed them..

Follow the beaten path. Boardwalks in thermal areas protect you and the park. Leaving them or touching hot water can cause severe burns or death. Geysers, mud pots, and hot springs are delicate—don't touch, throw anything in, or alter them.

Be bear aware. Carry bear spray and know how to use it. Be alert, make noise, hike in groups, and stay on trails. If you encounter a bear, never run.

Watch out for water. Be cautious near rivers, lakes, and streams. Cold, fast waters can cause hypothermia or drowning.

Practice safe selfies. No picture is worth hurting yourself, others, or the park. Be aware of your surroundings whether near wildlife, thermal areas, roads, or steep cliffs.

Enjoy the ride. Drive cautiously and follow speed limits. Watch for hazards like bison. Use pullouts for photos, stay with your car in wildlife jams, and turn off your engine when stopped.

Leave your drone at home. Drones are not allowed in Yellowstone National Park. They disturb wildlife, interfere with park operations, and bother people trying to enjoy natural sounds.

Clean, Drain, Dry. Help us prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Clean, drain, and dry your watercraft and fishing gear before you come into the park or move from one body of water to another.

Stash your trash. Recycle what you can and put the rest in bear-resistant trash cans so animals can't get to it. If a can is full, find another.

Leave what you find. Don't take antlers, artifacts, rocks, plants, or other objects from the park.

Take the pledge. Tell a friend. Protect the park.

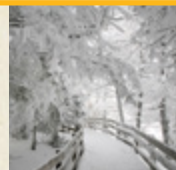

CANYON VILLAGE



Washburn Lodge at Canyon Lodge

Canyon Lodge & Cabins

May 16 - October 26

Centrally located in the park, Canyon Lodge & Cabins is just north of the beautiful Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone. It offers a mix of lodge rooms and western cabins, all with private bathrooms. Five lodges have LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification.



Canyon Campground

May 30 - September 21

Centrally located in the park, Canyon Campground is located near Canyon Village with restaurants and stores. It offers tent, travel trailer, and RV sites under 40ft. Showers and coin laundry are located on-site.

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO

National Park Service Visitor Center



The Canyon Visitor Education Center features interpretive exhibits related to the Yellowstone super-volcano. Through interactive exhibits, animations, audio-visuals, and real-time scientific data you will gain an understanding about how Yellowstone's volcano, geysers, hot springs, and geologic history affects life here.

Drive The Rim Roads



Drive the North and South Rim roads of the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone near Canyon Village. Designated overlooks along the way offer breathtaking views of the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone River and the Upper and Lower Falls of the Yellowstone River. A number of trails and walkways wind along the rims and partway into the canyon.

Hike the North Rim Trail



From the Canyon Lodge Cabins area take the Grandview Point Trail leading through the woods. This trail joins with the North Rim Trail with follows the canyon rim down to Inspiration Point. There are many overlooks to stop at going either direction on the North Rim Trail from the junction. The North Rim Trail is a nice diversion from driving and parking along the North Rim Drive.

OLD FAITHFUL VILLAGE



Old Faithful Inn

May 2 - October 13

The most famous of all national park lodges, Old Faithful Inn first opened in June 1904 with log beams and native stone. The immense lobby rises 76 feet and features a massive stone fireplace and a large handcrafted clock. The Old Faithful Inn offers a mix of suites, hotel rooms, historic rooms with bathroom and with shared bathrooms.

Old Faithful Snow Lodge & Cabins

April 25 - October 26

Open during the summer and winter seasons, the Snow Lodge is the newest lodging facility in Yellowstone and is located a short walk from the Old Faithful Geyser Basin. Old Faithful Snow Lodge & Cabins offers lodge rooms and cabins, all with private bathrooms.

Old Faithful Lodge Cabins

May 9 - October 5

This historic lodge and cabin facility is located near Old Faithful Geyser Basin and has a one-story main lodge built in the 1920s featuring massive logs and stone pillars with tremendous views of Old Faithful Geyser. The Old Faithful Lodge offers cabins with private bathrooms and with shared bathrooms.

Bear Paw Deli at Old Faithful Inn

Open May 2 - October 19

Grab-n-go - Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner, Ice Cream

Located in the lobby of the Old Faithful Inn. The Bear Paw Deli offers counter service espresso, specialty to-go sandwiches, salads, and snacks with a small seating area. Indulge in ice cream from May 29 - September 24.

Bear Pit Lounge at Old Faithful Inn

Open May 2 - October 19

Drinks, Appetizers

The Bear Pit Lounge is located next to the dining room in the Old Faithful Inn lobby. Enjoy the historic stained glass bear panels with you enjoy drinks, appetizers, burgers, and more.

Mezzanine Espresso Cart and Bar

Open May 2 - October 19

Located on the 2nd floor mezzanine of the Old Faithful Inn. Grab a drink and head to the porch for a geyser eruption.

Obsidian Dining Room at Snow Lodge

This full service sit down restaurant located at the Snow Lodge features a regional specialties menu and buffet options. First come, first served.

Geyser Grill at Snow Lodge

Open April 25 - October 31

The Geyser Grill is a quick service restaurant with an American style menu. Located near the Snow Lodge Gift Shop.

Firehole Lounge at Snow Lodge

Bear Den Bistro at Snow Lodge

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO



Old Faithful Inn Walking Tour

Come and learn the fascinating history and unique qualities of this National Historic Landmark. This FREE TOUR departs the Old Faithful Inn Lobby at 9:30 am, 11:00 am, 2:00 pm, and 3:30 pm daily from May 4 through October 13.



National Park Service Visitor Center

The Old Faithful Visitor Education Center, which opened in 2010, contains exciting interactive exhibits explaining Yellowstone's rare thermal features and a Young Scientist room for visitors of all ages. The theater features frequent showings of park videos. Stop at the Visitor Education Center for the next prediction for Old Faithful and a few other geysers or call 307-344-2751.

Tribal Heritage Center

The Yellowstone Tribal Heritage Center is a space where indigenous artists, scholars and presenters from the 27 associated Tribes of Yellowstone National Park directly engage with visitors through demonstrations and discussions.



Upper Geyser Basin Walk

Starting at the Old Faithful Inn and the National Park Service Visitor Center you'll find a network of paved paths and boardwalks that wind through the highest concentration of geysers in the world. Predictable geysers in this area include Old Faithful, Castle, Grand, Daisy, and Riverside. The full loop is 3 miles but shorter distances can be achieved depending on the route you choose.

Fountain Paint Pot Trail

North of Old Faithful Village along the Grand Loop Road you will find the parking lot for Fountain Paint Pot Trail. This 0.6 mile boardwalk leads through an area with all four types of geothermal features, geysers, steam vents, mud pots and hot springs.

Lone Star Geyser Trail

Hike or bike along the Firehole River to this cone geyser which erupts for 30 minutes about every 3 hours. Bring a box lunch and spend some quality time in this lovely area. This is an easy, 4.8-mile round-trip trail. Trail head is just south of Kepler Cascades parking area.

Observation Point

Take the boardwalk across the Firehole River and follow the signs up the hill. You'll have a bird's-eye view of the geyser basin and a front row seat for Old Faithful's eruption. This is a steep 1-mile round-trip hike, but worth the effort.

GRANT VILLAGE



Grant Village Lake House Restaurant

Grant Village

May 30 - October 5

Grant Village is located near the West Thumb Geyser Basin area of Yellowstone, and the closest Yellowstone location to the Grand Teton National Park. The village is named after President Ulysses S. Grant, who established Yellowstone as the world's first national park in 1872. It has provided modern motel-type accommodations.

Grant Village Campground

June 6 - September 14

The campground is located 22 miles north of the South Entrance, along the shores of Yellowstone Lake in Grant Village near West Thumb Geyser Basin. It offers tent, travel trailer, and RV sites under 50ft. Stores, restaurants, showers, and coin laundry are located in the village area.

The nearest EV charging station is in Old Faithful Village 17 miles away.

Guest Wi-Fi is not available in Grant Village.

Grant Village Dining Room



May 30 - October 5

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

The Grant Village Dining Room is a stand alone building located near the hotel buildings. It is a full service sit down restaurant featuring a selection of regional menu items. Breakfast and lunch are first come, first served. **Reservations are required for dinner and can be made at the host desk or by calling 307-242-3499.**

Seven Stool Saloon

May 30 - October 5

Beer, Wine, & Cocktails

Located inside the Grant Village Dining Room, the Seven Stool Saloon has just that, seven stools, from which you can enjoy local micro-brews and signature cocktails.

Lake House Restaurant

May 30 - September 28

Dinner

Located on the shores of Yellowstone Lake, follow the signs from the hotel or dining room area through the forest down to the lake shore, or if you prefer to drive, follow the signs at the entrance to Grant Village. This is a fast casual restaurant featuring Baja style tacos with views of the lake.

Grant Village Gift Store

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO

West Thumb Geyser Basin



Stroll through the beautiful West Thumb Geyser Basin situated on the shores of Yellowstone Lake. The boardwalk trail is just over a mile long and twists through colorful hot springs and dormant lake shore geysers. West Thumb Geyser Basin is located approximately 2 miles north of Grant Village on the Grand Loop Road.

National Park Service Visitor Center



The Grant Village Visitor center offers a stunning view of Yellowstone Lake. Learn about fire ecology and the famous 1988 fire season in its interpretive displays. Check the NPS visitor guide or ask in the visitor center about ranger programs.

West Thumb Overlook Trail



For a great view of Yellowstone Lake and the Absaroka Mountain Range, hike the West Thumb Overlook Trail. This two-mile trail starts at the west end of the West Thumb parking lot, crosses the South Entrance Road and climbs about 400 feet through meadows and forest.

MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS

Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel & Cabins

April 25 - March 2, 2026

The Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel is open in the summer and winter. In the winter, this is the only hotel in the park accessible by private vehicle. The hotel is near the north entrance to the park and a popular base for wildlife watchers heading to Lamar Valley. Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel & Cabins offers suites, hotel rooms, cabins with private bathrooms, cabins with shared bathrooms and hot tub cabins with private bathrooms.



In 2025 the Mammoth Hotel will be open between the summer and winter seasons through November and early December. Winter tours start December 16.

Guest Wi-Fi is available in guest rooms, the lobby, and Map Room. Wi-Fi is not available in the cabins.

Mammoth Hot Springs Dining Room



April 25 - March 2, 2026

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Mammoth Hot Springs Dining Room sets a high standard for sustainability by being the first restaurant in the National Park Service to achieve 4-Star certification from the Green Restaurant Association. This is a full service sit down restaurant featuring a diverse menu and buffet options. The dining room is located next to the main hotel.

Terrace Lounge

April 25 - March 2, 2026

Beer, Wine, Cocktails, & Appetizers

Located in the Mammoth Hot Springs Dining Room, the Terrace Lounge feature appetizers, locally brewed draught beers, and distilled spirits.

Terrace Grill

April 25 - October 13

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner, Ice Cream

The Terrace Grill is a quick service restaurant with an American style menu located in the dining room building. Also serving ice cream in the summer.

Map Room Bar

April 25 - March 2, 2026

Coffee / Beer, Wine, & Cocktails in the evening

Located in the hotel lobby, the Mammoth Map Room serves coffee in the morning and beer, wine, and cocktails in the evening with live piano music most nights.

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO

National Park Service Visitor Center



The Albright Visitor Center & Museum and the red-roofed houses were built by the U.S. Cavalry as Fort Yellowstone, an Army post dedicated to protecting the first national park. This beautiful stone visitor center building features exhibits focusing on the ecology of Yellowstone's Northern Range, the development of the National Park idea, and the history of Fort Yellowstone. Check the NPS visitor guide or ask in the visitor center about ranger programs.

Historic Self-Guided Walking Tour



Pick up a guide in front of the NPS Visitor Center and take a self-guided walking tour of Mammoth's historic Fort Yellowstone buildings.

Explore the Mammoth Terraces



Drive or walk from the hotel, about a 1/2 mile, to the boardwalks at the base of the Mammoth Terraces. Here you'll find travertine terraced thermal pools and the famous Liberty Cap. You can also take the Grand Loop Road to the Upper Terrace Loop parking lot. From here you can explore the upper terraces on foot or drive the short, scenic, one-way loop drive. In the winter the Upper Terrace Loop Drive is turned into a cross-country ski trail, cars can only access the parking lot.

YELLOWSTONE LAKE VILLAGE



Lake Yellowstone Hotel

Lake Yellowstone Hotel & Cabins

May 9 - October 5

Gleaming with 1920s grandeur, Lake Yellowstone Hotel is a classic building from the golden age of touring. First opened in 1891, it is Yellowstone's oldest and most elegant hotel, and listed on the National Register of Historic Places and a designated National Historic Landmark. Lake Yellowstone Hotel & Cabins offers suites and hotel rooms in the main hotel. Hotel rooms in the adjacent Sandpiper Lodge and cabins with bathrooms.

Lake Lodge Cabins

June 10 - October 5

Enjoy spectacular views of Yellowstone Lake from the porch of the main lodge of this comfortable cabin complex. All cabins have private bathrooms.

Bridge Bay Campground

May 16 - September 1

The campground is located adjacent to Bridge Bay Marina, three miles south of Fishing Bridge Junction in the Yellowstone Lake area. It offers tent, travel trailer, and RV sites under 40ft. Showers and coin laundry are located nearby at Fishing Bride RV Park.

Fishing Bridge RV Park

May 9 - October 12

Fishing Bridge RV Park has RV spaces for hard-sided RV's and travel trailers up to 95 feet in length. No tents or soft (pop-up) trailers allowed. Showers and coin laundry are located in the RV park.



Lake Yellowstone Hotel Dining Room



June 27 - October 5

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Inside the historic Lake Yellowstone Hotel, this elegant sit-down restaurant boasts an exquisite dinner menu. Lunch and breakfast menus plus a breakfast buffet. Breakfast and lunch are first come, first served.

Reservations for dinner are required and can be made at the host desk or by calling 307-242-3899.

Lake Hotel Lounge

June 27 - October 5

Beer, Wine, & Cocktails

Located in the Sun Room of the Lake Hotel, relax and sip a drink while watching the sunset on the Lake. Enjoy music from a string quartet or piano from mid-June through early August in the Sun Room.

Lake Hotel Deli

May 9 - June 26 / *6:30 am - 10:30 am only

June 27 - October 5 / regular hours

Grab-n-go, Breakfast, Lunch*, Dinner*, Located in the Lake Hotel the deli offers specialty deli sandwiches, soups, and Starbucks coffee. The Lake Hotel Deli has counter service with a small seating area.

Wiley's Canteen at Lake Lodge

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO

LAKE YELLOWSTONE AREA

National Park Service Visitor Center

The Fishing Bridge Visitor Center and Museum is one mile east of Fishing Bridge Junction on the East Entrance Road. The visitor center and museum highlight the ecology of Yellowstone Lake, focusing on birds.



Elephant Back Trail

Enjoy this hike through a dense lodgepole pine forest to a sweeping panoramic view of Yellowstone Lake and the surrounding area. This moderately strenuous trail is a 3-mile loop starting one mile south of the Fishing Bridge Junction. This is a staff favorite!



Storm Point Trail

This is an easy hike to the scenic, windswept Storm Point. The 3-mile trail starts at the Indian Pond turnout three miles east of the Fishing Bridge Visitor Center and passes through an open meadow, a forested area, and then takes you along the lake shore. Look for the colony of yellow-bellied marmots that make their home near the rocky point.



Mud Volcano

About 8 miles north of Lake Yellowstone Village on the Grand Loop Road you'll find the Mud Volcano thermal area. This thermal area features bubbling mud pots, boiling mud pots, and a hot spring called Dragon's Mouth.

ROOSEVELT LODGE AREA

Old West Dinner Cookout

Slough Creek Trail

This scenic trail leads to a favorite area for catch and release anglers. The trail follows a historic wagon trail up Slough Creek through several meadows and over Plateau and Elk Tongue Creeks. This trail is moderately strenuous for the first 1.5 miles, then it is easy and takes one to three hours each way. Trail head begins at the Slough Creek Campground (about 9 miles east of Roosevelt Lodge).

Fishing Bridge RV Park

Near Fishing Bridge Junction, this RV park features 310 sites for hard-sided RVs, with hookups for electricity, water, and sewer. Amenities include showers, laundry, camping supplies, and snacks at the registration building. Restaurants, stores, and tours are available nearby in Lake Village.

Canyon Campground

Centrally located in the park, Canyon Campground is located near Canyon Village with restaurants and stores. Showers and coin laundry are located on-site. Restaurants and stores are conveniently located at Canyon Village.

Grant Village Campground

Situated on Yellowstone Lake's southwest shore, 22 miles north of the South Entrance, this campground is close to West Thumb Geyser Basin. Stores, restaurants, showers, and laundry facilities are located in Grant Village.

Bridge Bay Campground

The campground is located adjacent to Bridge Bay Marina, three miles south of Fishing Bridge Junction in the Lake Area. Showers and coin laundry are located nearby at Fishing Bride RV Park. Bridge Bay Marina has boat rentals, guided tours, and fishing trips. Restaurants and stores are two miles north at Lake Village, with laundry and showers at Fishing Bridge RV Park and Grant Village Campground.

Madison Campground

Just 16 miles north of Old Faithful Village, Madison Campground sits at the confluence of the Gibbon and Firehole Rivers, forming the Madison River. Madison Mercantile is on-site for camping essentials, snacks, s'mores fixings, souvenirs, and apparel. Restaurants, stores, and pay showers are available nearby at Old Faithful Village.

BE BEAR AWARE

Improperly stored or unattended food will be confiscated and you could be fined.

Treat **odorous products** like soap, toothpaste, fuel products, suntan lotion, & bug spray in the same manner as food.

Never store food, garbage, or toiletries in tents or sleeping bags.

Place all trash in **bear-resistant garbage dumpsters**.

Pets must be kept under physical restraint and never left unattended.

Immediately report careless campers and all bear sightings to the campground registration building or nearest Park Ranger.

CAMPGROUND INFORMATION

All campgrounds operated by Yellowstone National Park Lodges have recycling and refuse containers nearby. Coin-operated ice and soda machines are located throughout the park.

RV SITES

Sites that accommodate RVs at Canyon, Bridge Bay, Grant Village, and Madison campgrounds are either pull-through or back-in with limited width for slide-outs and **MAY NOT BE LEVEL**; please plan accordingly. Some sites are shaded while others are in open areas.

CHECK-IN / CHECK-OUT AND CAMPSITE ASSIGNMENT

At all campgrounds, check-in time is 1:00 pm and check-out time is 11:00 am. Campsites are assigned at check-in. Accessible sites are available.

FOOD STORAGE

Food storage regulations are strictly enforced at all campgrounds. Food odors attract bears. Any items containing food residues and scents **MUST NOT** be left outside or in tents/tent trailers at any time. Food must be stored in bear-proof lockers located throughout the campground or in a hard-sided vehicle.

PICNIC TABLES AND FIRE GRATES

Individual campsites have one picnic table and one fire grate (except at Fishing Bridge RV Park which has no fire grates and only has picnic tables in Loop E). Group campsites have one picnic table and one fire grate for approximately every six people and are for tent camping only.

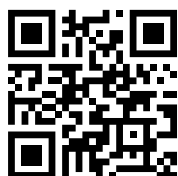

Cross-Country Ski & Snowshoe Trails

Yellowstone offers a variety of enjoyable and challenging trails for cross-country skiers. A number of trails in the park are groomed for classic stride as well as skate skiing. All trails are marked but may be untracked.



The Old Faithful* area (elev. 7,350 ft.) offers about 70 miles of cross country ski trails, beginning right out the front door of your lodge. Many of these trails provide access to the unique thermal features in the area where bison, elk and other animals take advantage of the warm ground.

Our staff will be happy to provide current information on weather, trail, snow conditions, and alert you to any special winter hazards.
