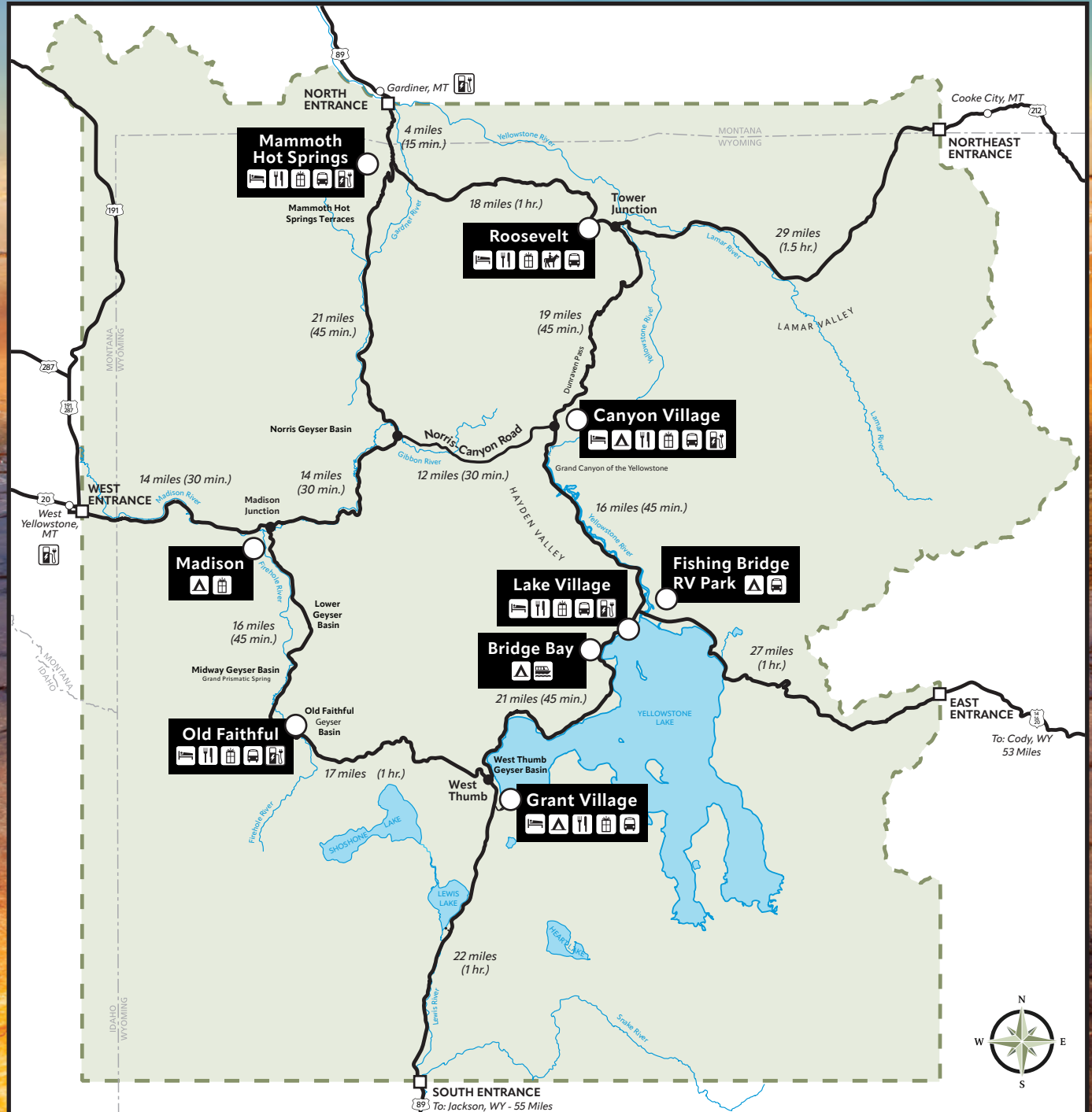

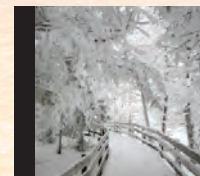

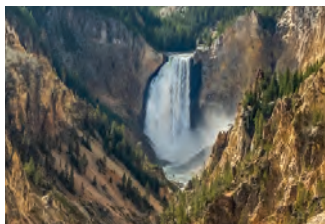

Canyon Lodge & Cabins

May 15 - October 25

Centrally located in the park, Canyon Lodge & Cabins is just north of the beautiful Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone. It offers a mix of lodge rooms and western cabins, all with private bathrooms. Five lodges have LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification.

Canyon Campground

May 29 - September 20

Centrally located in the park, Canyon Campground is located near Canyon Village with restaurants and stores. It offers tent, travel trailer, and RV sites under 40ft. Showers and coin laundry are located on-site.

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO IN THE CANYON AREA



National Park Service Visitor Education Center

The Canyon Visitor Education Center showcases Yellowstone's super-volcano through interactive exhibits, animations, and real-time scientific data, offering insights into the park's geothermal features and geology.

Drive The Rim Roads

Explore the North and South Rim roads near Canyon Village for stunning views of the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone and its Upper and Lower Falls. Designated overlooks and trails provide plenty of opportunities to take in the scenery.

Hike the North Rim Trail

Start at the Grandview Point Trail near Canyon Lodge Cabins, which connects to the North Rim Trail. This scenic path follows the canyon rim to Inspiration Point, with multiple overlooks along the way—a great alternative to driving the North Rim Drive.

Old Faithful Inn

May 1 - October 12
The most famous of all national park lodges, the Old Faithful Inn first opened in June 1904 with log beams and native stone. The immense lobby rises 76 feet and features a massive stone fireplace and a large handcrafted clock. The Old Faithful Inn offers a mix of suites, hotel rooms, and historic rooms with shared bathrooms - a few offer en-suite bathrooms.

Old Faithful Snow Lodge & Cabins

April 24 - October 25
Open during the summer and winter seasons, the Snow Lodge is the newest lodging facility in Yellowstone and is located a short walk from the Old Faithful Geyser Basin. Old Faithful Snow Lodge & Cabins offers lodge rooms and cabins, all with private bathrooms.

Old Faithful Lodge Cabins

May 8 - October 4
This historic lodge and cabin facility is located near Old Faithful Geyser Basin and has a one-story main lodge built in the 1920s featuring massive logs and stone pillars with tremendous views of Old Faithful Geyser. Surrounding the main lodge building are cabins with private and shared bathrooms.

Madison Campground

May 1 - October 18
Madison Campground is on the west side of the park, just 16 miles north of Old Faithful Village, with campsites for tents, RVs, and trailers up to 40 feet long. Madison Mercantile is on-site for camping essentials and snacks. Showers, coin laundry, restaurants, and stores are available a short drive away at Old Faithful Village.

Old Faithful Inn Dining Room

May 1 - October 12
Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Located in the Old Faithful Inn, the dining room is a grand and rustic space. This is a full service sit down restaurant featuring a diverse menu and buffet options. Breakfast and lunch are first come, first served.
Reservations are required for dinner and can be made at the host desk or by calling 307-545-4999.

Bear Paw Deli at Old Faithful Inn

May 1 - October 12
Grab-n-go - Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner, Ice Cream
Located in the lobby of the Old Faithful Inn. The Bear Paw Deli offers counter service espresso, specialty to-go sandwiches, salads, and snacks with a small seating area. Indulge in hand scooped ice cream during the summer.

Bear Pit Lounge at Old Faithful Inn

May 1 - October 11
Drinks, Appetizers
The Bear Pit Lounge is located next to the dining room in the Old Faithful Inn lobby. Enjoy the historic etched glass bear panels with drinks, beer, cocktails, appetizers, burgers, and more.

Mezzanine Espresso Cart & Bar at the Inn

May 1 - October 11
Located on the 2nd floor mezzanine of the Old Faithful Inn. Grab a drink and head to the porch for a geyser eruption.

Obsidian Dining Room at Snow Lodge

April 24 - October 25
Breakfast, Dinner
This full service, sit down restaurant located at the Snow Lodge features a menu with regional specialties. First come, first served during the summer.

Geyser Grill at Snow Lodge

April 17 - October 31
Lunch, Dinner
The Geyser Grill is a quick service restaurant with an American style menu. Located near the Snow Lodge Gift Shop.

Firehole Lounge at Snow Lodge

April 24 - October 24
Drinks, Appetizers
The Firehole Lounge is located next to the Snow Lodge Obsidian Dining Room. Enjoy an afternoon or evening drink from the bar and select appetizers after 4 pm.

Fireside Bear Den Bistro at Snow Lodge

April 24 - October 25
Located in the Snow Lodge lobby. It's open 24/7, with a variety of snacks, candy, sandwiches, ice cream, beverages, as well as sundries, books, and a limited assortment of souvenir items. A selection of coffee beverages are available.

Old Faithful Lodge Cafeteria

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO IN THE OLD FAITHFUL AREA



National Park Service Visitor Education Center

The Old Faithful Visitor Education Center, which opened in 2010, contains exciting interactive exhibits explaining Yellowstone's rare thermal features and a Young Scientist room for visitors of all ages. The theater features frequent showings of park videos. Stop at the Visitor Education Center for the next prediction for Old Faithful and a few other geysers or call 307-344-2751.

Tribal Heritage Center

The Yellowstone Tribal Heritage Center is a space where indigenous artists, scholars and presenters from the 27 associated Tribes of Yellowstone National Park, directly engage with visitors through demonstrations and discussions.

Fountain Paint Pot Trail

North of Old Faithful Village along the Grand Loop Road you will find the parking lot for Fountain Paint Pot Trail. This 0.6 mile boardwalk leads through an area with all four types of geothermal features, geysers, steam vents, mud pots and hot springs.

Observation Point

Take the boardwalk across the Firehole River and follow the signs up the hill. You'll have a bird's-eye view of the geyser basin and a front row seat for Old Faithful's eruption. This is a steep 1-mile round-trip hike, but worth the effort.

Upper Geyser Basin Walk

Starting at the Old Faithful Inn and the National Park Service Visitor Center you'll find a network of paved paths and boardwalks that wind through the highest concentration of geysers in the world. Predictable geysers in this area include Old Faithful, Castle, Grand, Daisy, and Riverside. The full loop is 3 miles but shorter distances can be achieved depending on the route you choose.

Lone Star Geyser Trail

Hike or bike along the Firehole River to this cone geyser which erupts for 30 minutes about every 3 hours. Bring a box lunch and spend some quality time in this lovely area. This is an easy, 4.8-mile round-trip trail. Trail head is just south of Kepler Cascades parking area.

Grant Village

May 29 - October 11

Grant Village is located near the West Thumb Geyser Basin area of Yellowstone, and the closest Yellowstone location to the Grand Teton National Park. The village is named after President Ulysses S. Grant, who established Yellowstone as the world's first national park in 1872. It provides modern motel-type accommodations.

Grant Village Campground

June 26 - September 27

The campground is located 22 miles north of the South Entrance, along the shores of Yellowstone Lake in Grant Village near West Thumb Geyser Basin. It offers tent, travel trailer, and RV sites under 50ft. Stores, restaurants, showers, and coin laundry are located in the village area.

DINING



Grant Village Dining Room

May 29 - October 11

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

The Grant Village Dining Room is a full service sit down restaurant featuring a menu of regional items and buffet options. Enjoy stunning lake views while you eat. Breakfast and lunch are first come, first served. **Reservations are required for dinner and can be made at the host desk or by calling 307-242-3499.**

Seven Stool Saloon

May 29 - October 11

Beer, Wine, & Cocktails

Located inside the Grant Village Dining Room, the Seven Stool Saloon has just that, seven stools, from which you can enjoy local micro-brews and signature cocktails.

Lake House Restaurant

May 29 - September 27

Dinner

Located on the shores of Yellowstone Lake, follow the signs from the hotel or dining room area through the forest down to the lake shore, or if you prefer to drive, follow the signs at the entrance to Grant Village. This is a fast casual restaurant featuring Baja style tacos, and incredible views of the lake.

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO IN THE GRANT AREA



West Thumb Geyser Basin

Stroll through the beautiful West Thumb Geyser Basin situated on the shores of Yellowstone Lake. The boardwalk trail is just over a mile long and twists through colorful hot springs and dormant lake shore geysers. West Thumb Geyser Basin is located approximately 2 miles north of Grant Village on the Grand Loop Road.

National Park Service Visitor Center

The Grant Village Visitor Center offers a stunning view of Yellowstone Lake. Learn about fire ecology and the famous 1988 fire season in its interpretive displays. Check the NPS visitor guide or ask in the visitor center about ranger programs.

West Thumb Overlook Trail

For a great view of Yellowstone Lake and the Absaroka Mountain Range, hike the West Thumb Overlook Trail. This two-mile trail starts at the west end of the West Thumb parking lot, crosses the South Entrance Road and climbs about 400 feet through meadows and forest.

The Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel is open in the summer and winter. In the winter, this is the only hotel in the park accessible by private vehicle. The hotel is near the north entrance to the park and a popular base for wildlife watchers heading to Lamar Valley. Mammoth Hot Springs Hotel & Cabins offers suites, hotel rooms, cabins with private bathrooms, cabins with shared bathrooms and hot tub cabins with private bathrooms.

Mammoth Hot Springs Dining Room

April 24, 2026 - March 8, 2027

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Mammoth Hot Springs Dining Room sets a high standard for sustainability by being the first restaurant in the National Park Service to achieve 4-Star certification from the Green Restaurant Association. This is a full service sit down restaurant featuring a diverse menu and buffet options. The dining room is located next to the main hotel.

Terrace Lounge

April 24, 2026 - March 8, 2027

Beer, Wine, Cocktails, & Appetizers

Located in the Mammoth Hot Springs Dining Room, the Terrace Lounge feature appetizers, locally brewed draught beers, and distilled spirits.

Terrace Grill

April 24 - October 12, 2026

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner, Ice Cream

The Terrace Grill is a quick service restaurant with an American style menu with hand dipped ice cream located in the dining room building.

Map Room Bar

OUR FAVORITE THINGS TO DO IN MAMMOTH HOT SPRINGS



National Park Service Visitor Center

The Albright Visitor Center & Museum, along with the red-roofed houses, was originally built by the U.S. Cavalry as Fort Yellowstone to protect the first national park. This historic stone building features exhibits on Yellowstone's Northern Range ecology, the National Park idea, and Fort Yellowstone's history. Check the NPS visitor guide or inquire inside about ranger programs.

Historic Self-Guided Walking Tour

Pick up a guide in front of the NPS Visitor Center and take a self-guided walking tour of Mammoth's historic Fort Yellowstone buildings.

Explore the Mammoth Terraces

From the hotel, it's a 1/2-mile walk or drive to the Mammoth Terraces boardwalks, featuring travertine pools and Liberty Cap. You can also drive the Grand Loop Road to the Upper Terrace Loop parking lot to explore on foot or take the scenic one-way drive. In winter, the loop becomes a cross-country ski trail, with car access limited to the parking lot.

Lake Yellowstone Hotel & Cabins

May 15 - October 11
Gleaming with 1920s grandeur, Lake Yellowstone Hotel is a classic building from the golden age of touring. First opened in 1891, it is Yellowstone's oldest and most elegant hotel, and listed on the National Register of Historic Places and a designated National Historic Landmark. Lake Yellowstone Hotel & Cabins offers suites and hotel rooms in the main hotel, lodge rooms in the adjacent Sandpiper Lodge, and cabins with bathrooms.

Lake Lodge Cabins

June 10 - October 4
Enjoy spectacular views of Yellowstone Lake from the porch of the main lodge of this comfortable cabin complex. All cabins have private bathrooms.

Bridge Bay Campground

May 15 - September 14
The campground is located adjacent to Bridge Bay Marina, three miles south of Fishing Bridge Junction in the Yellowstone Lake area. It offers tent, travel trailer, and RV sites under 40ft. Showers and coin laundry are located nearby at Fishing Bridge RV Park.

Fishing Bridge RV Park

May 8 - October 18
Fishing Bridge RV Park has RV sites for hard-sided RV's and travel trailers up to 95 feet in length. No tents or soft (pop-up) trailers allowed. Showers and coin laundry are located in the RV park.

Lake Yellowstone Hotel Dining Room

May 15 - October 11
Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Inside the historic Lake Yellowstone Hotel, this elegant sit-down restaurant boasts an exquisite dinner menu. Lunch and breakfast menus plus a breakfast buffet. Breakfast and lunch are first come, first served. **Reservations for dinner are required and can be made at the host desk or by calling 307-242-3899.**

Lake Hotel Lounge

May 15 - October 11
Beer, Wine, & Cocktails
Located in the Sun Room of the Lake Hotel, relax and sip a drink while watching the sunset on the Lake. Enjoy music from a string quartet or piano from mid-June through early August in the Sun Room.

Lake Hotel Deli

May 15 - October 11
Grab-n-go, Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
Located in the Lake Hotel the deli offers specialty deli sandwiches, soups, and Starbucks coffee. Enjoy convenient counter service and a small seating area.

Wiley's Canteen at Lake Lodge

YELLOWSTONE PLEDGE

"I pledge to protect Yellowstone National Park. I will act responsibly and safely, set a good example for others, and share my love of the park and all the things that make it special."

PUT THE PLEDGE INTO ACTION!

Give wildlife room, use a zoom. View wildlife safely with a telephoto lens, scope, or binoculars. Park animals like bison, bears, and elk are dangerous and have harmed people. Keep 100 yards (91 m) from bears and wolves, and 25 yards (23 m) from other animals. Never approach, encircle, follow, or feed them..

Follow the beaten path. Boardwalks in thermal areas protect you and the park. Leaving them or touching hot water can cause severe burns or death. Geysers, mud pots, and hot springs are delicate—don't touch, throw anything in, or alter them.

Be bear aware. Carry bear spray and know how to use it. Be alert, make noise, hike in groups, and stay on trails. If you encounter a bear, never run.

Watch out for water. Be cautious near rivers, lakes, and streams. Cold, fast waters can cause hypothermia or drowning.

Practice safe selfies. No picture is worth hurting yourself, others, or the park. Be aware of your surroundings whether near wildlife, thermal areas, roads, or steep cliffs.

Enjoy the ride. Drive cautiously and follow speed limits. Watch for hazards like bison. Use pullouts for photos, stay with your car in wildlife jams, and turn off your engine when stopped.

Leave your drone at home. Drones are not allowed in Yellowstone National Park. They disturb wildlife, interfere with park operations, and bother people trying to enjoy natural sounds.

Clean, Drain, Dry. Help us prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species. Clean, drain, and dry your watercraft and fishing gear before you come into the park or move from one body of water to another.

Stash your trash. Recycle what you can and put the rest in bear-resistant trash cans so animals can't get to it. If a can is full, find another.

Leave what you find. Don't take antlers, artifacts, rocks, plants, or other objects from the park.

Take the pledge. Tell a friend. Protect the park.

FISHING BRIDGE RV PARK

Fishing Bridge RV Park offers 310 sites for hard-sided RVs up to 95 feet long, with full hookups for electricity, water, and sewer. On-site amenities include showers, coin laundry, and camping supplies. Additional restaurants, stores, and tours are 4 miles away in Lake Village.

CANYON CAMPGROUND

Canyon Campground, centrally located in Yellowstone, offers wooded sites for tents, RVs, and trailers up to 40 feet long. On-site amenities include showers and coin laundry. Restaurants, gas, and stores are located nearby in Canyon Village.

GRANT VILLAGE CAMPGROUND

BE BEAR AWARE

Keep a clean camp! Improperly stored or unattended food will be confiscated and you could be fined.

Treat **odorous products** like soap, toothpaste, fuel products, suntan lotion, & bug spray in the same manner as food.

Never store food, garbage, or toiletries in tents or sleeping bags.

Place all trash in **bear-resistant garbage dumpsters**.

Pets must be kept under physical restraint and never left unattended.

Immediately report careless campers and all bear sightings to the campground registration building or nearest Park Ranger.

CAMPGROUND INFORMATION

All Yellowstone National Park Lodges campgrounds provide recycling and trash containers. Coin-operated ice and soda machines are available throughout the park.

RV SITE FEATURES

RV sites at Canyon, Bridge Bay, Grant Village, and Madison campgrounds are pull-through or back-in, with limited width for slide-outs, and MAY NOT BE LEVEL. Some sites at Fishing Bridge RV Park offer limited width for slide-outs and are located on gravel pads. All campgrounds can have a mix of open and tree covered sites.

CHECK-IN / CHECK-OUT AND CAMPSITE ASSIGNMENT

Check-in is at 1:00 pm, and check-out is at 11:00 am. Campsites are assigned at check-in. Accessible sites are available.

FOOD STORAGE

Strict food storage rules are enforced to prevent bear encounters. Food and scented items must not be left outside or in tents/tent trailers. Food must be stored in bear-proof lockers located throughout the campground or in a hard-sided vehicle.

PICNIC TABLES AND FIRE GRATES

Each campsite includes one picnic table and one fire grate, except at Fishing Bridge RV Park, which has no fire grates and picnic tables only in Loop E. Group campsites, for tent camping only, provide one picnic table and fire grate per six people.

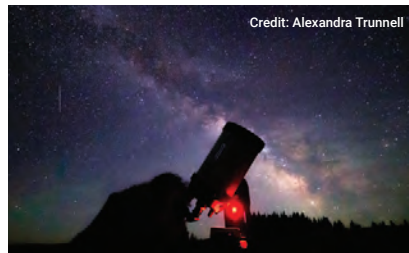
